Blackstone

New York-based investment management firm Blackstone relocated their technology office to Miami's Central Business District, joining SoftBank, CI Financial and Thoma Bravo in the move south. They acquired two buildings with nearby access to the Brightline train station that will link its 200 tech workers to the region, and its new home will put the company at the center of the county's burgeoning tech, innovation and investment marketplace.





Blockchain.com is betting big on Miami. The consumer and institutional crypto solutions provider was one of several cryptocurrency exchanges, digital banking and e-commerce players to hit Enter earlier this year. Lured by local crypto and STEM ecosystems, and City of Miami Mayor Francis Suarez's vocal tech stance, the company will create 800 new jobs to the county. In all, moves here from San Francisco grew 49% year-over-year, notes real estate firm CBRE.





The next ride you hail here could be an autonomous vehicle from Ford Motor Co. In partnership with Argo Al and Lyft, the company's ride-sharing "robotaxi" service is testing in Miami - its first-ever test market. The move marks the next step in Ford's commercial autonomous-vehicle business, which also announced a partnership with Walmart and Argo for robo-deliveries. In all, Ford will create 200 jobs to the county.














KEY CEREMONY

REMI Tax-PI is a dynamic modeling software that incorporates different aspects of modeling approaches which include input-output, general equilibrium, econometrics, and economic geography. It includes economic, demographic and policy variables so that any project or policy that affects the local economy can be tested. REMI models are used by government agencies (including most U.S. state governments), consulting firms, nonprofit institutions, universities, and public utilities.



2020-2021 KEY <u>TRENDS</u>

Challenges can happen in a flash. Trends emerge over time. What trends lured new recent arrivals and will continue into 2022 and beyond?



GREATER MIAMI AT THE GLOBAL CROSSROADS.

Miami blossomed as a hub of trade and logistics. Miami International Airport and PortMiami have invested billions to prepare for goods arriving from across the hemisphere and around the world, and developers have built millions of square feet of warehouse, distribution and logistics facilities. Cargo kept the ports open during the pandemic as shippers found inroads closer to their marketplace. This only promises to continue in the e-commerce era.



A FOCUS ON TALENT.

People learned during Covid that if you truly can work from anywhere, it might as well be in the sunshine. Leading employers across the tech, health and innovation sectors followed and found a growing sea of skilled talent, and the universities and workforce development organizations eager to customize training to meet employers' unique talent needs.





The Beacon Council's years-long focus on the tech sector set the stage to connect the thousands of tech employers and talent who relocated to Greater Miami over the past year. Partners like Microsoft, Blackstone, Ford AV and others proved our long view remained in focus.





INTERNATIONAL INTEREST REMAINS STRONG.

The Beacon Council's transition to virtual trade missions broadened our reach - at lower cost and with greater impact. Collaboration with teams from Finland, Spain, England, Japan and throughout the Americas kept the global spotlight on Miami.



YESTERDAY'S WORK, TOMORROW'S COMMUNITY-WIDE IMPACT.

Efforts to lure employers in key target sectors, such as financial services, technology, life sciences, trade and logistics, as well as the increase in headquarters relocation, have driven new jobs and wages double the county average. Projects already in the pipeline will continue these gains.
